Dear Chairman DeFazio and Ranking Member Graves:

I am requesting funding for the Marissa Main Street Resurfacing project in surface transportation reauthorization legislation.

The project sponsor for this project is Chad Easton and the project is located on North and South Main Street from IL Route 13 to Risdon School Road and Doza Creek Road in Marissa, Illinois 62257.

The funding is designated for the project which is seeking approximately 1.0 miles of milling and hot-mix asphalt resurfacing of North and South Main Street. from IL Route 13 (Lyons Street) to the Risdon School Road and Doza Creek Road at the south corporate limit of the Village of Marissa. The project consists of pavement patching, spot curb and gutter repairs, reconstruction of sidewalk and curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act standards, resurfacing of side road approaches to establish positive drainage flow, providing aggregate wedge safety shoulders for the south 0.1 miles of pavement, and pavement marking including crosswalks.

The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer dollars and is anticipated to have the following benefits. The project will ensure compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and will improve the conditions of the road, which will improve the safety of the road for users.
